- All exhibitors must enter their displays at their own risk.
- Work may commence on Thursday 9th February from 2pm to 9pm, and entries will be taken until 9am Friday 10th February 2012
- Judging will commence at 10am Friday 11th

Unless otherwise stated:

- Judges decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into
- Any Plant material in its natural state may be used. Artificial colouring may be used
- Fresh plant material other than wired work must be in water or water retaining materials unless it remains turgid for the full period of the show
- Exhibits must be the individual exhibitors own work
- No artificial plant material may be used
- Drapes, bases and accessories may be used
- Plant material need not be grown by exhibitor
- Pre-constructed and pre-woven plant material may be used but should not be the dominant part of the design

Definitions for Decorative Work

- Natural embellishments are all things made by nature other than flowers, eg., pebbles, dried materials, feathers, shells etc.
- Artificial embellishments are anything made by man, eg., figurine, ribbon, painter and/or dried plant material. No silk flowers
- Any embellishments are anything the exhibitor may wish to use, natural or artificial

Definitions of Exhibitors' Status

- Beginner: Exhibitor may compete in four (4) shows to gain experience, then must advance to Novice Class
- Novice: The Exhibitor may gain two champion or best exhibit awards before advancing to Restricted Classes
- Restricted – B Grade: Not open to Judges, Teachers or Professionals. 4 Champions – GI Show ONLY. Must then be an open competitor
- Open: Open to all exhibitors
- Advanced Junior: Over 8 years and under 14 years
- Junior: 8 years and under

21. "A Sea Creature of any kind" - Created from vegetables, fruits, succulents etc.
To be arranged on a sheet of cardboard 30cm x 21cm (12"x8 1/2")
22. "Wild Flowers in a Bottle"
23. "Olympic Theme" - Design on a sand tray, eg Olympic Flag etc. *(30cmx20cm/12"x8")*
24. "Floral Saucer" - Saucer to be covered with flowers and/or foliage to form a pattern. *Should be domed (wet sand) with border of leaves and/or petals which just cover the edge of the saucer*

Entry must be the work of the Competitor

25. "A Rabbit" - made from vegetables and/or fruit & succulents
