Conditions of Entry

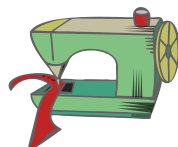
- All work to be executed by the exhibitor

- Articles must not be washed except where otherwise stated. Cleanliness is essential to all work under penalty of disqualification.
- Specimen means one article only.
- Prizes will not be awarded if in the opinion of the Judge the exhibit does not possess sufficient merit. **If less than two exhibits in class, prizes may not be awarded at the Judge's discretion.**
- **The outer cover of all exhibits forwarded by post to have the senders' name and address clearly marked.**
- **No makers' name or label are to be on any specimen.**
- The Show Society and Stewards will not be responsible for exhibits left after 4pm Sunday 12th February, unless prior arrangements have been made with the Stewards
