Horse Stalls & Stallion Boxes & Camping Fees and conditions on Application Form

- Applications for Stabling must be accompanied by payment.
- Fax, email or phone bookings *will not be held* unless payment is confirmed by 4pm Monday 6th Feb 2012.
- Cancellations prior to 4pm Monday 6th Feb 2012 will be refunded in full. Cancellations after this date may forfeit their fee.
- Preferences for stabling will be given in the following order – Visitors, Country Competitors, Glen Innes Town Competitors.
- Allocations will be finalised by 5.00pm Tuesday 7th February 2012.

Any donations of prize winners' ribbons—in good condition—back to the Show Society would be greatly appreciated.

Conditions

- Indemnity Forms must be signed before entering the Show Ring. These are available from the Horse Caravan located near the yards.
- Wrist Bands will be issued upon signing Indemnity Forms—These must be worn at all times whilst competing at this show.
- All competitors in any section of any Glen Innes Show COMPETE ENTIRELY AT THEIR OWN RISK. Entries are only accepted on this understanding.
- All owners competing at the Show, compete on the understand that DRUG TESTING of horses/ owners may be carried out at this Show and if drugs are detected then severe penalties will apply.
- The Committee stipulates that entrants pay attention to correctness of dress for events in which they are participating, and coats must be worn for all hack and hunter classes.
- For classes restricted to Glen Innes Severn, horses must be owned and permanently stabled within Glen Innes Severn local government area and ridden by a local resident.
- Stallions may only exhibit in classes provided, and may compete in Rodeo events held during the Show. No Stallions may compete in Hack or Hunter classes.
- Electric fences MAY NOT be erected on the Showground during Show Week.
- All exhibitors and/or grooms entering the Showgrounds shall obey the lawful directions of the President, Committee, Stewards, or employees of the Show Society and failure or refusal to do so, shall entitle the President of the Society to disqualify the Exhibitor and/or the exhibit from competing at the Show and may order the removal of the Exhibitor and/or exhibit from the grounds.
- Exhibitors will comply with the Workplace Health and Safety Act, its Regulations and all relevant Codes of Practice.
- This Society supports the wearing of suitable ASA approved helmets in horse events.
- A Maiden is a Hack that has not won a first prize in a Hack Class.
- A Novice Hack is open to horses that have never won an Open Champion Hack.
- An Intermediate Hack is open to horses that have never won first prize as a Hack at a Royal Show.
- Horses may compete in both Hack and Hunter Classes.
- In Champion events the horse must be ridden by the same rider who rode it to win in that class.
- Champion winners from Open Pony Hack, Open Galloway Hack and Open Hack are eligible to compete for Supreme Champion Hack.
- Where there is no competition in any section it will rest with the Judge to decide whether exhibits are worthy to receive a prize.
- Only Judges, Stewards, and the Competitors in the class being judged will be allowed in the ring. Competitors in each class must report to the Judge within three (3) minutes of the final call for that class. No more competitors in that class will be admitted to the ring and judging will proceed. All competitors compete at their own risk.
- A Parent or Parents of Child shall NOT enter the Show Ring whilst the competitor is competing in any event unless so authorised by the Chief Ring Steward and two Committee Members, and the Sub-Committee shall take whatever action it deems appropriate.
- While every effort will be made to follow the program the Stewards reserve the right to change scheduling of events.
- The Society reserves the right to measure horses as required. A Pony is under 14hh. Galloway is 14hh & under 15hh. Hack is 15hh and over.
- If, in the opinion of the Ringmaster or Steward in charge of the ring, any animal is entered in the wrong class, the Ringmaster or Steward shall have the power to enter the animal in its correct class prior to the commencement of judging of the class
- In Breed Classes, all animals must be registered (where required with the Breed Society) and registration papers (where applicable) must be available at the Show as proof of registration
- No alcohol is permitted in the Main Ring
- No mobile phones permitted in the Main Ring by competitors
- All protests must be delivered to the Ringmaster in writing within half an hour after an award has been made, with a deposit of \$25 which may be forfeited if the protest is dismissed
- Electrical Notice. Any exhibitors intending to bring electrical equipment to the Showground will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with earth leakage circuit breakers and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected and tagged by a licensed electrical contractor. This is essential for the safety of yourself, your fellow exhibitors and the general public and is a requirement of the Occupational Health and Safety Act of 1989. The Act imposes very severe penalties in the event of non-compliance with its provisions. Any exhibitors who do not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at the Glen Innes Showground. Please check all your electrical equipment and leads before you arrive to avoid the occurrence of any difficulties

Prohibited Drugs

- It is the intention of these regulations that all animals shall perform on their merits without the aid of drugs which will affect the conduct, performance and appearance of the animal.
- An exhibitor shall NOT administer and shall procure that there shall NOT be administered to his/her exhibit any drug or substance herein called a 'prohibited drug'. Prohibited drugs are substances originating externally whether or not they are endogenous to an animal by its actions upon the central or peripheral nervous system, the cardiovascular system, the respiratory system, the alimentary-digestive system., the musculo-skeletal system or the urogenital system, and SHALL INCLUDE analgesics, antihistamines, anti-inflammatory agents, blood coagulants, diuretics, anaesthetics, muscle relaxants and tranquilisers and vitamins. The use of antibiotic substances (anti-viral, anti-microbial, anti-parasitic) with the exception of procaine penicillin may be permitted.
- In the case of Showjumping and Dressage entries ONLY, which are conducted under F.E.I. Rules, the use of phenylbutazone and oxyphenylbutazone is permitted provided the maximum level of either or both does not exceed 3 micrograms per millilitre of plasma, in aggregate, at the time which the exhibit is to be judged.
- The Glen Innes Show Society Inc (or Central Northern Group of Show Societies Inc.) may at its discretion cause an examination to be made of an exhibit by a veterinary officer who in the course of such examination may make by such methods as he/she may determine such tests of and samples from such exhibit as he/she deems necessary or advisable. The result of the examination shall be reported to the Group and the Society.
- An exhibit to which, in the opinion of the veterinary officer, a prohibited drug has been administered shall not be exhibited without the consent of the Group and shall be removed from the Showground forthwith upon notice from the Group or Society.
- The Group may at its sole discretion impose the penalties applicable in the light of all information made available and may disallow or cancel the entry and any award made to the exhibit, without in such case being called upon to give reason therefore.
- The owner or any other person who was in charge of the animal to which a prohibited drug has been administered will be disqualified and penalties shall apply.
- **THE PENALTIES TO APPLY SHALL BE 12 months' disqualification from exhibiting** within this Group for the animal and the person in charge of the animal. It will be **recommended to the Agricultural Societies' Council of NSW that these penalties shall apply on a state wide level and that disqualification should be state wide.**
- If the animal is not presented for examination within the time specified by the Group, then the same penalties shall apply as if a prohibited drug was detected.
- **No 'Treatment Forms' will be acceptable.**
- Any person who at any time administers or causes to be administered for the purpose of affecting the performance of an animal in any event of class at the Show any drug as defined previously or has in his/her possession any improper contrivance may be disqualified or otherwise penalized by the Group.
- Particular attention will be paid to the detection of sedative and tranquilliser groups of drugs but analysis for all classes of prohibited substances will be included. The collection of samples, inter alia, will always involve taking urine and/or blood.
- An examination may include an examination for an animal being desensitised by any means will be considered to have competed under the influence of a prohibited substance and penalized accordingly.
- The owner or his/her representative may be present during testing, but shall not interfere in any way with the conduct of the test, and will observe the instructions of the veterinary officer on duty.
- The Society (or Group) and any servant or appointee of the Society or Group shall not be liable to the exhibitor, owner or their interested parties, for the death of, or for any injury, damage or infection which may be sustained by an exhibit occasioned by or arising out of any act or omission of any servant, agent or appointee of the Society or Group done or committed in the course of his/her examination whether due to the negligence of any such servant, agent or appointee or otherwise.
- Exhibitors must abide by the directions of the Society or Group as to the procedures to be followed for the examination of their exhibit and failure to adhere to these directions shall incur the same penalties as if prohibited drugs were detected.
