### PLEASE NOTE:

1. Judging of the wool will commence at 9am Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> February 2012. Wool to be in the pavilion by 2pm Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> February. Prizemoney & exhibits may be collected from the pavilion on Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> February 2012 between 3pm & 4pm.
2. Wool entered in Objective Measurement Class to be left with the Chief Steward or delivered to the pavilion by 12pm Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> February.

### Conditions of Entry

- All entries, including rams' fleeces, to be skirted. No exhibit will be allowed to compete in more than one class. The amount of extra growth to be stated on the entry form of all entries showing over 12 months' growth
- All wool to be grown in the 2011/2012 season by the exhibitor and to be from un-rugged sheep. Rams' fleeces eligible only in rams' wool classes
- Housed – shedded and stud fleeces allowed to compete in housed and stud section only
- The judge is empowered to move fleeces which he considers are entered in the wrong class
- Any exhibitor who wishes his wool or part thereof to be included in the District Exhibit for the R.A.S must leave written authority with the Chief Wool Steward
- The following scale of points will be awarded in judging:- Trueness to type 20, evenness 10, character 10, length 6, soundness 6, softness 6, density 6, colour 6, top and tail 30, making a total of 100 points
- NOTE:- An additional 20 points for matching ability and evenness of pairs
- Wool can be donated for sale by Glen Innes Show Society or Wool Section

2. One fleece of fine wool, approximately 70s count
3. One fleece of medium wool, approximately 64s count
4. One fleece of strong wool, approximately 60s count
5. One fleece of unshorn hogget wool, fine or superfine, 70s or over count
6. One fleece of unshorn hogget wool, medium or strong
7. **One fleece of ram's wool, fine approximately 70s count**
8. **One fleece of ram's wool, medium, approximately 64s count**
9. **One fleece of ram's wool, strong approximately 60s count**

Open to all un-rugged skirted Merino ewe and wether wools, and not more than twelve months' growth. Each fleece, numbered A, B & C, will be individually micron tested and typed for commercial value. Placed on highest commercial value of group
